



PM3 | Intake & Investigation


Average number of days to complete the entire enforcement process for cases not transmitted to the AG. (Includes intake and investigation)









Operational Report

The Board currently has two vacancies and plans to hold interviews in early December.

Given the fact that several staff continue to be dedicated to the BrEZe project and the two current vacancies, there are backlogs in the areas of enforcement, advanced practice applications, website updates and various administrative reports.

Budget Update

Attached is information re: revenue collected and expenditures during the period July 1-September 30th. Through Q1, the Board has collected \$390k and spent \$391k (final budget is still being fine-tuned). As a reminder, Budget Change Proposals were submitted to augment current staffing levels; information about the status of these requests will be available March 2016.

BreEZe Project:

The new BrEZe system will provide on-line functionality (such as applying for or renewing a license, submitting an advanced practice application) and back-office functionality (such as processing applications, auditing PDU compliance, and tracking complaints and investigations).

Board staff continues to support the BrEZe project, including user acceptance testing (UAT) which started September 23rd and will continue through December 21st; additional staff are also doing data validation during this period.

Organizational change management and training activities continue through go-live on January 19th. These activities include business process modeling, identifying gaps in our current processes and the functionality/system capabilities in BrEZe, developing suggested solutions to identified gaps, staff training in the use of the new system and development of a transition guide; all activities are to support the goal of a high-level of staff readiness for the transition from the current systems to BreEZe.

The DCA BrEZe Project calendar and request to DCA for deadlines/messages are attached.

To inform licensees and applicants of BrEZe coming and deadlines/constraints, information was added to the Board's website and the Board's Facebook and twitter accounts. (Samples attached)



What is OT?

For millions of people, the service of occupational therapy is a lifeline. People of all ages receive it to help them participate in the activities of their daily life. Sometimes people need occupational therapy to do things we take for granted, like getting dressed, being productive at school or work, eating unassisted, even socializing.

Occupational therapists do this by helping people surmount their disabilities or medical conditions to do everyday things. The nature of the therapy depends on the individual and their environment; occupational therapists consider the whole person when developing a therapy plan. Occupational therapists collaborate with physicians and other professionals to ensure a comprehensive approach.

Occupational therapy has its roots, a century ago, in helping war veterans return to life at home. These days, occupational therapists work in rehabilitation hospitals and on the front lines of combat. Some occupational therapy programs help soldiers recognize and relieve stress. AVOID UNNECESSARY DELAYS IN YOUR LICENSE ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL!

The Board of Occupational Therapy is scheduled to transition to the new BreEZe online licensing and enforcement system in January 2016.

The transition to the new system will require a temporary shutdown of all licensing processes for several business days, and could result in delays in processing initial license applications, license renewals, and changes such as name changes or changes of address.

License Renewals: Individuals holding an OT/OTA license with a December 31, 2015, expiration date who wish to renew their licenses are strongly encouraged to renew as early as possible, but not later than **December 22nd**. Individuals holding a license with a January 31, 2016 expiration date are strongly encouraged to renew as early as possible or online January 20, 2016.

Renewal applications and checks may be sent to the Board's office and will be processed through Tuesday January 5th. Otherwise, licensees may use the BreEZe system and renew online on or after January 20th.

Please note: Renewals cannot be processed January 6-19. Renewal processing will resume when BreEZe goes live.

New Licenses: Individuals seeking an initial OT/OTA license are strongly encouraged to apply online on or after January 20, 2016 to help avoid delays in application processing. (Paper applications will be accepted but cannot be processed during the period December 24 - January 19 due to temporary system shutdown.)

The new BreEZe system will, among other things, allow online license applications or renewals, allow payment online with a credit card in a secure environment, and allow individuals to track their applications.

We will be posting more information about the new BreEZe system in the coming weeks.

An act to add Chapter 2.6 (commencing with Section 18898) to Division 8 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to athletic trainers.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 161, Chau. Athletic trainers.

Existing law provides for the regulation of various professions and vocations, including those of an athlete agent.

This bill would make it unlawful for any person to hold himself or herself out as an athletic trainer, use the title of, among others, athletic trainer, or to use specified terms to imply or suggest that the person is an athletic trainer, unless he or she is certified by the Board of Certification, Inc., and has either graduated from a college or university, after completing an accredited athletic training education program, as specified, or completed eligibility requirements for certification by the Board of Certification, Inc., as specified. The bill would make it an unfair business practice to use the title "athletic trainer," "certified athletic trainer," or other specified terms that imply or suggest that the person is an athletic trainer if he or she does not meet the requirements described above.

This bill, notwithstanding these provisions, would authorize a person who has worked as an athletic trainer in California for a period of 20 consecutive years prior to January 1, 2016, and who is not otherwise eligible to use the title "athletic trainer," to use that title.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2.6 (commencing with Section 18898) is added to Division 8 of the Business and Professions Code, to read:

CHAPTER 2.6. Athletic Trainers

- **18898.** (a) A person shall not hold himself or herself out to be an athletic trainer, use the title "athletic trainer," "certified athletic trainer," "licensed athletic trainer," "registered athletic trainer," or any other term such as "AT," "ATC," "LAT," or "CAT" to imply or suggest that the person is an athletic trainer, unless he or she meets the following requirements:
- (1) He or she has done either of the following:
- (A) Graduated from a college or university after completing an athletic training education program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, or its predecessors or successors.
- (B) Completed eligibility requirements for certification by the Board of Certification, Inc., or its predecessors or successors.
- (2) He or she is certified by the Board of Certification, Inc., or its predecessors or successors.
- (b) It is an unfair business practice within the meaning of Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 17200) of Part 2 of Division 7 for a person to use the title "athletic trainer," "certified athletic trainer," "licensed athletic trainer," "registered athletic trainer," or any other term such as "AT," "ATC," "LAT," or "CAT," that implies or suggests that the person is an athletic trainer, if he or she does not meet the requirements of subdivision (a).
- **18899.** Notwithstanding Section 18898, a person who has worked as an athletic trainer in California for a period of 20 consecutive years prior to January 1, 2016, and who is not otherwise eligible to use the title "athletic trainer," may use the title "athletic trainer."
