# Discussion regarding SB 1050 (Alquist), Autism: telehealth task force.

### **SENATE BILL**

No. 1050

#### **Introduced by Senator Alquist**

February 8, 2012

An act to add and repeal Section 4643.4 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to autism and autism spectrum disorders.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1050, as amended, Alquist. Autism: telehealth-taskforce. task force.

Existing law requires the State Department of Developmental Services to develop evaluation and diagnostic procedures for the diagnosis of autism disorder and other autistic spectrum disorders, as specified. Existing law also requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to convene, with input from the University of California, the California State University, the department, and other appropriate entities, an advisory committee to develop recommendations identifying the means by which public and nonpublic schools, including charter schools, can better serve pupils with autism spectrum disorders and their parents.

This bill would, until January 1, 2019, require the department to establish an autism telehealth-taskforce task force and identify a lead administrator to be responsible for the activities and work of the taskforce task force. The taskforce task force would be required to provide the department with recommendations in the area of telehealth services for individuals with autism spectrum disorders, as specified.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares all of the 2 following:

3 (a) Telehealth is an effective mode of delivering health services
4 to underserved and isolated populations.

5 (b) Studies have shown that telehealth can be a valuable tool

6 for increasing the effectiveness of treatment and improving access

7 for children and young adults diagnosed with autism spectrum

8 disorders (ASD). At times, patients with ASD are not diagnosed
9 or are not treated due to the lack of adequate health services.

of are not freated due to the fack of adequate freatin services.
(c) The use and implementation of telehealth technology may
have the potential to revolutionize the care available to individuals

with ASD in a health care climate characterized by limited
 resources by providing all of the following:

14 (1) Greater knowledge and information about ASD to consumers15 and their families.

16 (2) Improved access to underserved communities and 17 populations.

18 (3) Enhanced case management.

19 (4) Increased coordination of care for this complex disorder.

20 (d) The utilization of telehealth-delivered services can help 21 achieve the goals of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable

22 Care Act that include better care, improved health outcomes, and 22 reduced per care is a care of care

23 reduced per capita cost of care.

(e) By deploying telehealth to better care for children with ASD,
the state can make larger improvements in its health and social
service systems.

SEC. 2. Section 4643.4 is added to the Welfare and InstitutionsCode, to read:

4643.4. (a) The State Department of Developmental Services
shall establish an autism telehealth taskforce task force.

31 (b) The department shall identify a public or nonprofit entity to

32 act as lead administrator to be responsible for all of the activities

33 and work of the task force task force, including identifying financial

34 support for the task force's costs. The public or nonprofit entity

35 shall have knowledge or experience in all of the following:

36 (1) Telehealth.

37 (2) Community-based clinical trials.

38 (3) Providing services to underserved populations.

(c) The lead administrator shall appoint, with the approval of
the department, members of the taskforce task force who have
knowledge or experience that includes, but is not limited to, any
of the following:

5 (1) The early identification of children with autism spectrum6 disorders.

(2) The treatment of autism spectrum disorders.

8 (3) Early intervention services provided by regional centers,
9 school districts, and community-based services.

10 (4) Technology or telehealth in providing services to individuals11 with autism spectrum disorders.

12 (5) Other areas deemed necessary by the department.

13 (d) Members of the taskforce task force shall serve at the
14 pleasure of the lead administrator without compensation, except
15 for appropriate travel, food, and lodging reimbursement.

16 (e) (1) The taskforce task force shall provide technical
17 assistance and recommendations in the area of telehealth services
18 for individuals with autism spectrum disorders to the department.

21 paragraph (1), the task force may provide recommendations to
22 the department that include, but are not limited to, regarding the
23 implementation of at least one or more demonstration-site sites
24 that promotes promote or evaluates evaluate any of the following:

26 (i) The use of telehealth and technology to assist and improve
27 the delivery of services for individuals with ASD by regional
28 centers.

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30 (ii) The use of telehealth to provide seamless integration and

31 coordination of services among regional centers, school districts,

*(iii)* The use of telehealth to improve the access of services for
individuals with ASD to underserved individuals and to reduce
the "digital divide" in underserved communities.

38 (B) Any recommendations regarding demonstration sites shall

39 include information about potential sources of funding that may

40 be available to the department to support the demonstration site.

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(e) No moneys from the General Fund shall be appropriated for this project. The establishment and responsibilities of the taskforce 1

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task force shall be contingent upon identification of appropriate 3

and adequate funding sources. 4

(f) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2019, 5

6 and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute, that

is enacted before January 1, 2019, deletes or extends that date. 7

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
